AP vs. Dual Credit

AP

Dual

- College credit earned by taking the AP Exam (3 or higher)
- Taught by high school teachers
- Weighted GPA (5 point scale)
- Classes taken during the school day
- 2016 AP exam cost is \$92 (free/reduced lunch fee reductions available)

- College-level rigor
- High student expectations
- Independent study skills are necessary
- **Current Freshman and Sophomores**—Dual and AP are weighted in GPA
AP is on a 5 pt. scale and dual credit is on a 4.5 pt. scale

- College credit earned by passing the class
- Taught by Hill College professors
- **Current Juniors and Seniors**—dual credit is pass/fail
- Classes taken during the school day, online, or afterhours at the Burleson Hill campus
- 2016 tuition is \$303 per class. No financial aid. Students buy books

GPA Changes for 9th & 10th Graders

Beginning with students entering grade 9 in the 2015–16 school year, all courses shall be used to compute a student's grade point average (GPA). This includes dual enrollment courses and online courses under the supervision of District personnel. **We encourage you to review the GPA weighting chart below and consider the impact of course selection on GPA.**
